### Home Learning

To continue to help your child this half-term please can **you encourage your child to read daily**. This involves encouraging your child to use the pictures to help them read unfamiliar words and understand the story. We will continue to change 2 books on a weekly basis. Please continue to read a range of books to keep your child's interest in reading. Please remember to record the books you read in your child's Reading Diary.

### Phonics Books (RWI)

We will continue to send home a phonics book and an Oxford Reading Tree book on a weekly basis. These will be changed throughout the week. Some children will also be bringing home a Ditty book from their phonics sessions. These will come home on a Friday. The phonics books focus on the current sounds your child has been learning and include green and red words. (To read green words we use our phonic knowledge to sound out, and red are our words to read by sight only).

Please remember to comment on observations when using Tapestry as we do welcome feedback. Thank you to all parents who have made comments or uploaded their own observations. We really value seeing what the children learn outside of school. Please remember to upload your own observations about your child's wonderful learning.
