Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
The consistency and quality of swim teaching has improved in the last three years. Children have learnt how to deal with difficult situations whilst out and swimming, which has been taught from beginner level all the way through. Beginners are also progressing at a quicker rate which means they are growing in competence and confidence.	Moving to a new system; children will start swimming in year 3, until they meet the expected standard. These places will be filled with non-swimmers from higher year groups who have not yet met requirements.
