

## Lyminster Primary School's Sport Premium Grant Action Plan 2022-2023

### Total allocation

#### Key achievements to date:

Swimming lessons restarted this year. Following on from a swimming survey sent out we sent the children from year 3 and 4 that were not able to swim. Next year we will continue with children in the new Year 3 class following on from a new swimming survey.
